When misuse is discovered, disciplinary measures will be taken against the misuse. The Student Affairs Office of Northern, or its designee, will review violations on a case-by-case basis.

## ACCESS MYNOC TO OBTAIN YOUR NORTHERN ACCESS USERNAME & PASSWORD

To obtain your Northern Access Username & Password:

- Go to myNOC (portal.noc.edu)
- Select the NOC Access tab
- Enter your 9-digit Student ID number
- Enter PIN (Date of Birth MMDDYYYY)
- Click on Display my Northern Access Credentials
- Write down your Northern Access

username and password and

keep

in a safe place.

NOTE: The Northern Access username and password are case sensitive.

Your Northern Access username and password should be used to log on to myNOC, Blackboard, Wireless Access, NOC computer labs and your NOC

#### TIPS TO REMEMBER

- Campus Connect can be accessed by logging in to myNOC, and used to view or print your unofficial transcript or schedule. You can also complete enrollment, set up payments and much more.
- Any holds placed on your student record will limit your access in Campus Connect until the hold(s) are cleared. Please contact the Registrar's Office for assistance.

- For students living in the residence halls, please <u>do not</u> access more than one Ethernet port in your assigned dorm room.
